ESTIMATING

The estimating department was recently awarded two unique projects going into 2025. The first project involves the rigging, unloading, and placing of heavy components for a press at a new customer's facility in Xenia, Ohio. The customer was looking for a rigging contractor with a solution to their difficult challenge. The challenge involved standing upright and setting in place two (2) vertical press frames with a weight of 340,000 lbs. each. This project was an excellent opportunity for PSC to display our depth in engineering solutions and our approach was ultimately what helped us secure the work. The second project involves the rigging and placing of yet another tunnel boring machine in the greater Cleveland, Ohio area. Again, PSC's engineered solutions were on display as this will be the largest single lift PSC has performed to date. The overall weight of the assembled tunnel boring machine will be 1,600,000 lbs. Our team's knowledge and our experience from past projects were two of the leading factors that helped us secure the project. The project in Xenia, Ohio is scheduled to be performed in late February 2025 and the tunnel boring machine is scheduled to be performed in March 2025.
